

VLIR-UOS awards full scholarships to applicants from 31 eligible countries in Africa, Asia and Latin America to attend one of the selected Master programs taught in English at a Belgian (Flemish) university or university college.

A call for scholarship applications is launched every year in November. The deadline for submission depends on the Master program you are applying for.

The 15 selected Master programs are organised for 5 years (2017-2021), with each year 12 scholarships

Development-relevant programs

VLIR-UOS supports a selection of development relevant master- and training programs, organised at a Flemish university or university college ranking among the best in Europe.

The International Master Programs (ICP) are accredited, initial or advanced Master programs (EQF 7) of one or two years (60 or 120 ECTS) on a development-relevant subject. The programs have a specific but non-exclusive focus on international participants, a.o. from the VLIR-UOS scholarship countries, with specific courses, applicable content and adapted teaching- and learning methods. Each master is supported with twelve scholarships.

International master programs

VLIR-UOS supports 15 International Master programs with a limited number of scholarships. Each year a call for candidates is launched in November for the following academic year. VLIR-UOS provides full scholarships for the total duration of the Master program (12/24 months). It is not possible to apply for a partial scholarship. A scholarschip covers:

- Monthly allowance
- One-time payments
- Visa fee
- Insurance, international travel and tuition fee









Eligibility criteria for a scholarship

Nationality and country of residence: A candidate should be a national <u>and</u> resident of one of 31 scholarship countries at the time of application



Age: The maximum age for an initial (2 years) master program candidate is 35 years and 45 years for an advanced master. The candidate cannot succeed this age on January 1 of the intake year.

Professional background: VLIR-UOS gives priority to candidates who are employed in academic institutions, research institutes, governments, social economy or NGO's, or aim a career in one of these sectors. The training candidate should have relevant professional experience and a support letter confirming (re)integration in a professional context.

Former VLIR-UOS scholarships: A candidate can only submit one VLIR-UOS scholarship application per year, irrespectively of the scholarship type. As a consequence, a candidate can only be selected for one VLIR-UOS scholarship per year.

The Master program candidate has never received a scholarship from the Belgian government to attend a master program or equivalent or was never enrolled in a Flemish higher education institution to attend a master program or equivalent before January 1 of the intake year.
